JEFFERSON CITY. The capital of Missouri, and the county seat of Cole Co., is located on the Missouri river, and on the M. P. Ry, 125 miles w of St Louis, and 157 e of Kansas City. The South Branch C. & A. Ry terminates at Cedar City, on the opposite side of the river, and a ferry runs in connection with all trains. It contains a number of fine buildings, amongst them the capitol, supreme court, governor's residence, the prison, Madison hotel, school-house, and some handsome churches. Of the latter, the following sects are represented: Baptist, Catholic, Episcopal, German Lutheran, Evangelical Lutheran, Methodist and Presbyterian. The schools are: 2 Catholic (male and female), 1 public, 1 private and Lincoln Institute; the latter has 116 scholars (col'd), and the public school has 11 teachers with an attendance of 516 scholars. A fine State Library contains 15 000 volumes, and Bragg's Hall will seat 400 people. This city became the capital of the State in 1826, was incorporated in 1839, and now has 5,140 inhabitants, with a bonded indebtedness of \$63,300, funded at an average of 6 per cent. The assessed value of real and personal property amounts to \$2,100,000. Its manufactories comprise 3 flour mills, foundry and machine shops, 2 breweries, the different works carried on in the prison by convict labor, embracing boots and shoes, saddle trees, saddles, harness, whips, blankets, etc., besides chairs and brooms. The 3 flour mills

shipped, during 1880, 110,000 barrels of flour. Hotel accommodation is afforded by 8 hotels, the most prominent being the Central City, Monroe and Madison. Three daily, 3 weekly and 3 German weekly newspapers are published. Shipments, flour, grain, stock, mules, horses, and goods made in the prison. 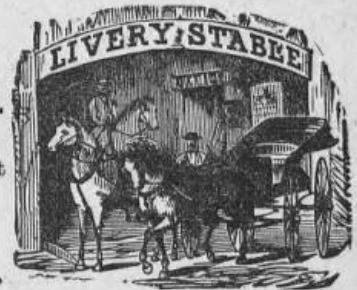
