

Dedication

Because of his bringing honor and national recognition to Jefferson City Senior High School, the Marcullus has been dedicated to Coach John V. (Pete) Adkins. Coach Adkins has been a member of the faculty and coaching staff for seven years. In all but his first year of coaching, Coach Adkins led the football Jays to undefeated seasons and 57 straight victories. Under his direction five players were named to All-American teams. This year he was awarded the Knute Rockney High School Football Coach Award and appeared on a panel of football coaches at a national convention in Chicago, Illinois. As a special tribute the Jay Boosters commissioned a local artist, Mrs. Carl Bosch, to paint his portrait in oils. At the annual Football Banquet the painting was unveiled and presented to Mrs. Adkins.












Mrs. Alan Becker presents graduates with their diplomas in the midst of the commencement downpour.








