## Dedication

Because of his bringing honor and national recognition to Jefferson City Senior High School, the Marcullus has been dedicated to Coach John V. (Pete) Adkins. Coach Adkins has been a member of the faculty and coaching staff for seven years. In all but his first year of coaching, Coach Adkins led the football Jays to undefeated seasons and 57 straight victories. Under his direction five players were named to All-American teams.
